## Swine Flu

How can you tell the difference between swine flu and the cold?

Symptom	Cold	Swine Flu
aches	slight aches and pains	severe aches and pains
blocked nose	blocked nose commonly present	blocked nose not usually present
chest discomfort	mild to moderate discomfort	often severe discomfort
chills	are uncommon	occur in more than half of cases
cough	mucus producing cough often present	dry cough usually present
fever	fever is rare	high fever is common and lasts 2-5 days
headache	rare and mild	very common
sneezing	common	rare
sore throat	commonly present	not commonly present
time scale	develops over a few days	develops over a few hours
tiredness	mild	moderate to severe



## H1NI (Swine Flu) Vaccinations

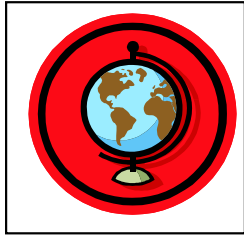
Swine flu vaccinations are now available for certain groups in this practice. At present the order in which they are given is being controlled by the Department of Health.

## Travel Medicine Charges



Most services provided by this practice are free under the National Health Service, however not all vaccinations or prescriptions in connection with travel abroad are available on the NHS.

From 7th December 2009, all private prescriptions for travel vaccines will incur a fee of £10.00 per injection.

This includes the following:

Hepatitis B  
(3 injections per course)

Rabies  
(3 injections per course)

Japanese B Encephalitis  
(2 injections per course)

Tick-Borne Encephalitis  
(3 injections per course)
